

Rotary Australia accepts original prints (no color photocopies) and digital photos via e-mail or CD/DVD. If you plan to submit digitally, please ensure that your photos meet the following specifications:

- Photos must be at least 300 dpi (the highest setting on most cameras)
- Photos must be at least 4" x 5" (at 300 dpi, this converts to a 2MB file)
- TIF or JPG file format only (we cannot accept photos embedded in Microsoft Word or PowerPoint, PDF or e-mail)


