Thanks Kate McMahon, terrific NYSF talk!

After overcoming some technical problems, Kate McMahon gave an excellent presentation about her NYSF experiences. Chelsea Rotary sponsored Kate to go to NYSF, but Kate had to pass several Rotary interviews before she was selected. The selection standard is quite high and the process is highly competitive. At NYSF, Kate spent 12 days with 199 other students living at the University of Queensland whilst learning about careers in Science and Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The Year 12 NYSF program has operated for 35 years, helping over 11,500 students. Although UQ has supported NYSF for 25 years, this is the first year that UQ has hosted the program, which includes visiting places such as UQ's Moreton Bay Research Station on North Stradbroke Island and the Centre for Hypersonics. The UQ NYSF program includes lab activities and visits to industrial and commercial sites, as well as debates, in which students develop interpersonal and communication skills. The program helped tremendously to open Kate's mind to the possibilities of alternative science careers, and in fact enabled her to consider an alternate career path to the one that she had previously



focussed on. We expect Kate will continue to be a credit to her school, her community, her family and Rotary and we wish her all the



very best in the several careers she is likely to pursue and do well in.

It looks like Maree and Co have made some significant progress in improving the ambient comfort when using the Town Hall foyer for meetings. We look forward to the results. Well done those people!

2018-19 Funding for Mens Shed Programs now open

Incorporated not-for-profit organisations and **local councils** across Victoria can apply for funding in the 2018-19 men's sheds \$875,000 program.

Projects may include:

- Construction of a new men's shed
- conversion of an existing facility into a men's shed
- construction of an addition to an existing men's shed
- modifications or upgrades to an existing men's shed to address accessibility or occupational health and safety requirements
- minor projects to provide solar panels, power upgrades or air conditioning/heating systems
- other capital improvements to men's shed facilities.

Priority will be given to projects that:

- Involve active management and participation by members of Aboriginal communities
- demonstrate a high level of need for the project in the community
- demonstrate capacity to enhance the health and wellbeing of members
- represent considerable value for government investment
- will address significant disadvantage in the local community
- support the inclusion of newly arrived migrant and refugee communities.

Aboriginal Community Organisations

Men's shed funding applications involving active management and participation by Aboriginal communities are a high priority. Assistance with the grant application process is available, including support from the department's Aboriginal Engagement Units. Flexibility around the grant requirements can also be provided.
