There are between 50 and 60 stallholders with a wide range of farm fresh produce including organic fruit and vegetables, artisan cheeses and olive oils, specialty breads, free range chicken and eggs, farmed barramundi, lamb,

beef and pork together with confectionery, baked goods and preserves.



Plastic-bag-free shopping is encouraged and alternative bags will be available for purchase.

The \$2 entrance donation goes to Chelsea Rotary who use the funds to support local community groups and charities.
