Chelsea Rotary Forum follow-up

As a result of the Survey and Club Forum, one of the main areas of concern that emerged was the suitability of the venue. With this in mind I ran a session with the club to review what we felt were the most important features in choosing a venue. Before we went into this exercise I reviewed the Club makeup, at this stage we have 30 members this number is made up of 14 retired members and 16 who are still working in some capacity, of this number 8 are women and 22 are men. I made the point that retired members may need to consider costs of a meal at a venue, but I forgot to mention that the nature of the retired person means that they may also travel for greater lengths of time thus reducing numbers at meetings. We also have amongst our thirty members, four irregular attendees.

After discussions, these were the agreed upon features that we want from a venue.

- Facility: professional, aesthetically appealing, good parking and storage for our equipment.
- Chelsea location.
- Good Value for money cost of food and drinks.
- Longevity we need a good relationship with management so that we do not need to keep moving.

Keith, Kevin, Simon and myself will follow up with these agreed-upon, not-negotiable features in mind. We will start again with the RSL as everyone agreed that it has a number of the attributes that we find important. From my own point of view, I want the venue firmly in place as soon as possible as this has been a long standing issue.

The second building project between RAWCS (Rotary) and the partnership with Palladium (Australian Aid) will commence on the 12th of March 2018 at Visale Beach, Guadalcanal, Solomon Islands.

The project requires the following trades

Carpenter, plumber, concreter and brick layer.

I need one of each of the above trades as well as **6 other people** to construct a 6 mt x 6 mt commercial kitchen from the ground up as well as the refurbishment of an existing building. Ladies are welcome to apply.

This project will contribute to the new TAFE training system being setup throughout the Solomon Islands by Australian Aid.

The volunteer cost will be less than \$1600.00 including accommodation excluding meals. The project is expected to be completed by the 30th of march, so the duration for Volunteers will be 2 weeks.
