

### Message from the President

Hi Folks,

Last Tuesday we heard from Greg Wragg about Hampton Rotary Club's involvement with providing Scholarships to students of the outer Yasawan islands of Fiji.

Without financial assistance to cover the cost of fees, books, uniforms, fares and living away from home expenses, it is prohibitive for many village families to continue to provide for education and associated costs for their children. Selected students must meet the strict criteria of the Scholarship fund to be eligible.

The Hampton Rotary club's Mission Statement is:

"The Rotary Club of Hampton's mission is to provide opportunities for selected students from remote areas to further their education at secondary and tertiary levels. In most cases this will be on the main islands."

Since 2004 many students have benefited from what is now known as the Rotary Club of Hampton Fiji Scholarship Fund which is accredited through Rotary Australia Word Community Service.

I am sure everyone enjoyed the presentation and hearing about the great work the Hampton Club is doing.

#### ROTARY'S MOTTO IS "SERVICE ABOVE SELF"

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

FIRST: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

SECOND: High ethical standards in business and professions, the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society.

THIRD: The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life.

FOURTH: The adv ancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.



Interplast's Intentions are simple. They exist to repair bodies and rebuild lives. At Rotary we work with this organisation to help them succeed.

In a nutshell, Interplast is a not-for-profit organisation working to improve the quality of life for people with disability who are disabled as a result of congenital or acquired medical conditions such as cleft lip and palate or burn scar contractures. We do this by sending fully qualified Australian and New Ze aland volunteer plastic and reconstructive surgeons, anesthetists, nurses and allied health professionals to the Asia Pacific region to provide free surgical treatment for patients who would otherwise not be able to afford access to such services.

The last couple of months have been very busy for Interplast's programs team, reflecting on the achievements from the 2014/15 financial year and reviewing all of our country programs.

Thanks to your support, in the 2014/15 financial year we implemented 58 program activities, an increase of 14% from the previous year. This included 31 training activities, 15 surgical activities, 6 planning and evaluation activities and 6 activities providing institutional support.

One of our major tasks for the past few months has been planning for the 17 individual annual country program plans for the 2015/16 period. Each of these 17 annual plans includes the various activities for each country, which are developed in collaboration with our local partners.

In addition to planning and reviewing, in June and July we implemented 10 program activities, including training of surgeons in PNG, Myanmar and Fiji, a craniofacial surgery program to Sri Lanka, nurse education in Kiribati, the Solomon Islands and Myanmar, training for a plastic surgeon from Laos in Perth, and providing institutional support to our partners in Mongolia and Nepal.

2015/16 promises to be another exciting and ambitious year at Interplast, with another 35% increase in programs planned. These planned programs have been developed in close collaboration with our local partners in each country where we work and with our volunteer Country Coordinators.
