## Not all boxes are created equal...

Lying at the bottom of cupboards everywhere are boxes filled to the top with items which may never see the light of day again. Packed high in garages, boxes hold treasures from the past we cannot bear to throw out.

To carry out vital surgery within the Asia Pacific region we transport our medical supplies overseas in purpose built medical equipment boxes that ensure our supplies arrive safely and remain fit for surgery.
