
There is no meeting on Tuesday (3 Nov) due to the Melbourne Cup, but I wish you good luck in any bets you have placed, and I hope you back a winner.

# **lain Uren's Visit to Kyrgyz**

lain started of his talk by stating it was his first time travelling without speaking any of the local language. That is always a tough start to a trip!

He went to Kyrgyz to attend a wedding of a friend he made in 2009-10 when studying in China. She was marrying an American man. The wedding was immensely expensive, they were driven around in Hummers, the wedding was held in the worlds biggest yurt. A traditional **yurt** (from the Turkic's) 1 is a portable, round tent covered with skins or felt and used as a dwelling by nomads in the steppes of Central Asia. Although the yurt for the wedding looks somewhat more elaborate than a traditional yurt.

Like all big gatherings there were some 'technical hick-ups' while trying to perform Can't Take My Eyes Off You at the wedding with the Brides Maids as not everyone was speaking the same language!

It was an elaborate wedding and endless amounts of alcohol the entire time he was Kyrgyz. In part because Iain is Caucasian he was constantly approached by people with the expectation that I could speak Russian, and was limited to saying "I don't understand" and "I Love You".

lain took the opportunity to travel by himself, and ended up making new friends and exploring Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan with other travellers.

Along the way he ate horse for the first time, some swimming in the worlds second largest in-land salt water sea and some hiking in the Tian Shan ranges.

As Iain says "It was an amazing trip, I highly recommend Central Asia for everyone."

# CONFRONTING THE SPECTRE OF POLIO BY KERRY HIGHLEY

Across most of the world, an entire generation has lived free from the spectre of polio, but for fifty years during the twentieth century that fear was overwhelming. Polio became every parent's worst nightmare, and panic drove rational people to do bizarre things to protect their children. Survivors of the disease often found that they faced a world unfriendly to their disability.

How to treat polio survivors generated a rift between the medical community and its recommendations and the approaches of those of those advocating alternative therapies for the paralysed body. In pre-Second World War Australia, two women symbolised this split. In her clinics in Australia, England, North America and Canada, Sister Elizabeth Kenny championed and practised a treatment diametrically opposed to the widely used 'orthodox' approach of Victorian Dr Jean McNamara. In Australia, the public's reverence of the medical profession entrenched her approach until well after most Western countries had abandoned it.


Dancing in My Dreams details the disease of polio and its treatment; the scientific endeavour that led to the discovery of the poliovirus; and the studies in virology and immunology that culminated in the production of a polio vaccine. It highlights the experiences of patients and the voices of survivors, revealing how ethnicity, class, age and gender all mediated an individual's reaction to having polio, which included fear, rejection, denial and anger.
