Rotary Foundation Centurion Club Report

In my role as Foundation Chair, I wish to report that I've recently been advised of the reconciliation of the District Centurion Club records with those of the Australian Rotary Foundation Trust for year 2015/16. As a result, I can confirm that last year '2015/16', personal giving through the Centurion Club Program achieved another all-time record high of \$60,943 from 410 generous Centurion Donors. This outstanding result is up from the \$55,684 achieved in year 2014/15.

Congratulations to everyone for making this happen, a great effort and Thank you! In order to do good around the world more often, **our Goal in 2016/17 must be 'To encourage more Rotarians to join the Centurion Program' which then not only assists our Foundation Globally but helps make available more District funds to our Club in 3 years' time.** Therefore, I would like to make this one of our 2016/17 Club Foundation Goals. After all, it may be your effort that will make all the difference.

Below is a **report which shows our Club's performance** in the Centurion program and lists member participation over the past four years.

As a way of assisting our Club to increase the participation rate, some Clubs enjoy great success through encouraging their members to Donate on a Weekly Basis. This is where the Club sanctions the idea of members (who wish to participate) contributing 'say \$2/week' towards the 'annual \$100 Centurion Membership (either by adding to their weekly meal fee or collected separately). The money is collected and collated until the member donation reaches \$100 then it is remitted with others on a common date (say Foundation month or June) each year. I hope that you may find this idea of some value in your Club service.

The Challenge to Lead Program is a 3-day residential leadership program run by the Rotary Club of Doncaster on **13th**, **14th** and **15th** October, **2016**.


