

# 30th Rotary Ride For Research \$\$\$s 2016 We CAN make it \$1million!

Ride, Sponsor or be a "virtual rider" are the key messages, and to get started, all you need to do is, read on. Each year we have a team of bike riders who spend a week of their holidays, fund their own trip and ride from a start point to our District Conference. They each seek sponsorship with ALL the funds raised go to Australian Rotary Health, for health research. Currently there are 131 research projects funded in 60 areas of medical and health research. These funds are currently invested in research into areas such as:

- Mental health current research in all stages of life
- Suicide and self harm prevention
- Alcohol and the effects in adolescence
- Brain diseases, Parkinson's, cancer, schizophrenia, epilepsy, dementia, Alzheimer's

This year, after 31 years of accumulated effort, the 2016 team are within touching distance of making the total raised \$1,000,000.00 -- One Million Dollars.

When you RIDE, you will be part of a team who set out from Mansfield on Monday March 14, 2016 and ride 650 km to arrive in Shepparton on Saturday March 19 2016. It is six days of sharing with the clubs that you meet on the trip, the people you meet going through the towns and the bumps on the road, the end of day bottom, and the laughs along the way. You will need to register and here is <u>the link for registration</u> to be a rider or a driver.

When you SPONSOR, you do the ride from your armchair and the steps are simple:

- Click on this link to the <u>Everyday Hero</u> web site.
- You have a choice you can sponsor **the team as a whole** or if you know someone who is riding, **you can sponsor an individual**.
- Decide on your sponsorship, enter the amount, and the tax receipt for your sponsorship will be produced, for you.
- Celebrate your participation, challenge a friend to match your contribution, and know that you are progressing research in Australia.

**There is a midway point. You can be a VIRTUAL RIDER**. Out of your armchair, but not on the roads from Mansfield to Shepparton. These steps are also very quick and simple.

- Click on this link to the Everyday Hero web site and register as a rider, this will cost you \$25.00.
- Contact your friends, family and work colleagues and ask them to sponsor you. Remember every dollar you raise goes to Australian Rotary Health for health research.
- Now when you ride on your training rides you can accumulate the 650km and you are raising money towards health research in Australia.
- We think this will appeal to all the past exchange students who will remember the ride to conference that they participated in during their exchange experience. You can be a **Virtual Rider** anywhere in the world.

So will your RIDE? Will you SPONSOR? Or will you be a VIRTUAL RIDER? Australian Rotary Health will benefit whichever way, you click.


